## **BOROUGH OF WESTVILLE**

Regular Council Meeting 165 Broadway August 8, 2016 - 7:00 p.m. Meeting Minutes

Mayor Welsh called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Clerk read the public notice and roll call was taken, with the following persons in attendance:

Bittner, Jr., Public Works Superintendent Donna Domico, Public Works Assistant Superintendent Martin E. Finger, Jr., Engineer Jon Bryson, Police Chief William Whinna and Solicitor Timothy Scaffidi

Absent: Council Members: Charles Murtaugh, Donna Moan and Bruce Nordaby

A motion to approve the Meeting Minutes from July 11th and July 15th, 2016 was made by Councilman Mailley and seconded by Councilman Sims. *Motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.* 

#### PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS ONLY:

Joyce Lovell, 328 Summit Avenue, inquired about bid information specific to the sale of the Water Utility and was instructed by Mayor Welsh to submit her request in writing to the Borough. Ms. Lovell asked additional questions about the potential sale of the Water Utility, e.g. continuation of the senior water discount, entry level salary grade at Aqua and staff reductions at Borough Hall. Mayor Welsh asked Ms. Lovell if she would hold the remainder of her questions, about the potential sale of the Water Utility, because they may be answered later in the meeting when this issue was revisited.

#### REPORTS OF THE COMMITTEES FOR JULY

A motion to approve the reports, as submitted, was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.

PRESENTATION took place y TRICOJIF (Gloucester, Salem, Cumberland CMunicipal Joint Insurance Fund) representative Paul FPaul Forlenza, Deputy Executive Director of the TRICOJIF (Gloucester, Salem and Cumberland Counties) made a presentation and discussed the Borough's membership in the company and pending renewal of membership in the organization. Mr. Forlenza talked about the history and success of JIF and how the group has exceeded its own expectations and grown as an organization. Mr. Forlenza discussed the organization's financial success and refunds issued to participating Municipalities in addition to providing information on how the TRICOJIF can provide advice on managing risks. Mr. Forlenza He advised reported on the money the Borough of Westville saved on the money thawas saved by joining he organization TRICOJIF and and commented ospoke about issues the company TRICOJIF is working on, in the future such as coverage for drones and the Wellness program. Mr. Forlenza informed Mayor and Council about Cyber Liability issues and the financial strength of the organization.

<u>FLOODING & TRAIN ISSUES:</u> No business was reported Administrator Bittner advised that there was nothing new to report.

❖ ORDINANCE NO. 11-2016 ∼ REPEALING CHAPTER 180, FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WESTVILLE AND HEREBY ADOPTING A NEW CHAPTER 180, FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION CHAPTER FOR THE BOROUGH OF WESTVILLE

Administrator Bittner advised the State has required the Borough to update the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance that is mandated by FEMA.

A motion to open the meeting to the public was made by Councilman Mailley and seconded by Councilman Sims. *The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.* 

Joyce Lovell, 328 Summit Avenue asked Administrator Bittner what hads changed between the old and new Ordinance. and Administrator Bittner advised that because of Superstorm Sandy some changes do not apply to the Borough, such as beach and dune erosions but the Ordinance changes building restrictions that may not have been present in the old Ordinance regarding building within a flood plain. Administrator Bittner further advised all new residences must have the first floor above flood plain level which is approximately 3 feet and that this requirement was not part of the old Ordinance. Administrator Bittner confirmed the Borough has to identify the flood plain areas.

A motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Councilman Mailley and seconded by Councilman Sims. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion to approve Ordinance No. 11-2016 was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote.

A motion to open the meeting to the public was made by Councilman Mailley and seconded by Councilman Sims. *The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.* A motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Councilman Sims and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion to approve Ordinance No. 12-2016 was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**: (Continued)

Solicitor Scaffidi advised Councilman Nordaby was joining the meeting via telephone. Municipal Clerk Helder placed a call to Councilman Nordaby at this time.

Clerk Helder took a second roll call: Mayor Russell W. Welsh, Jr., Council President Michael O. Ledrich, Council Members: Paul C. Mailley, Bruce Nordaby and Fritz H. Sims, Jr., were in attendance.

# Public Hearing on:

\* ORDINANCE NO. 13-2016 ~ APPROVING THE CONSIDERATION OF A PROPOSED SALE BETWEEN THE BOROUGH AND AQUA NEW JERSEY, INC. FOR THE SALE OF THE BOROUGH'S WATER UTILITY SYSTEM AND AUTHORIZING A PROPOSAL TO BE PRINTED ON THE BALLOT FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE VOTERS WITHIN THE BOROUGH AT THE GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016 TO APPROVE A PROPOSED SALE OF THE BOROUGH'S WATER UTILITY SYSTEM TO AQUA NEW JERSEY, INC.

Administrator Bittner advised Ordinance No. 13-2016 approves the sale of the Water Utilities and also places a question on the ballot to the voters as to whether or not to approve the sale. Administrator Bittner stated if not approved by the voters, the sale cannot take place; however, if voters approve the sale, Mayor and Council still have the option not to move forward with the sale. Administrator Bittner confirmed Ordinance No. 13-2016 approves the sale of the Water Utility and the bid documents as they were received by Aqua (New Jersey).

A motion to open the meeting to the public was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.

Joyce Lovell, 328 Summit Avenue, stated she would like in writing, details on how the billing will occur with Aqua and asked if Aqua employees would be onsite in Westville. Public Works Manager Domico stated a full time onsite water operator is required by the State so someone from Aqua would be in Westville. Ms. Lovell expressed her concern about Aqua's response time to fix a water main break. Public Works Manager Domico advised Ms. Lovell it is in Aqua's best interest to fix breaks as soon as possible so the problem does not affect the Borough's water allocation. Ms. Lovell expressed her concern about the Borough's current water meters being compatible with Aqua's technology. A lengthy discussion took place regarding the Borough's debt liability, plans for the funds after payment of the debt and using the remaining funds to possibly place a freeze on the Local Purpose Tax and offsetting the —Seewer rate if and when the www.ater rates increase. Further discussion took place regarding the Governing Body communicating the ramifications if the sale of the Water Utility is not passed by Westville voters that would include repairs to the old water mains.

A motion to close the meeting to the public was made by Councilman Mailley and seconded by Council President Ledrich. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion to approve Ordinance No. 13-2016 was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote. After the vote, the telephone call with Councilman Nordaby was terminated so that he could return to work.

Administrator Bittner confirmed there were no significant changes to the policy, only required updates by JIF.

A motion to approve Resolution No. 95-2016 was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote.

❖ RESOLUTION NO. 96-2016 ~ AUTHORIZING AN AUCTION FOR VEHICLES NO LONGER NEEDED IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Mayor and Council advised they wanted wording on the Resolution changed from "asking price" to state "minimum bid"

A motion to approve Resolution No. 96-2016 was made by Councilman Sims and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote.

❖ RESOLUTION NO. 97-2016 ~ AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A CONTRACT RENEWING MEMBERSHIP IN THE GLOUCESTER, SALEM, CUMBERLAND COUNTIES MUNICIPAL JOINT INSURANCE FUND

A motion to approve Resolution No. 97-2016 was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion unanimously approved by roll call vote.

Motion to approve Resolution No. 99-2016 was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. *Motion unanimously approved by roll call vote*.

❖ RESOLUTION NO. 100-2016 ~ AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE TOWNSHIP OF DEPTFORD FOR A ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT ON RYAN AVENUE

Administrator Bittner advised he spoke with Deptford's Deputy Administrator and confirmed there will be no costs to the Borough of Westville and that all expenses will be covered by the grant.

Motion to approve Resolution No. 100-2016 was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. *Motion unanimously approved by roll call vote*.

#### **NEW BUSINESS: (Continued)**

**❖** AGREEMENT with Saint Francis Veterinary Center for Canine Remi in the amount of \$750, authorized by Chief Whinna. Term of Agreement is July 1, 2016 through July 1, 2017.

Chief Whinna confirmed there is no longer money in the Dog Trust Account. Councilman Sims asked if the contract exceeded the retirement date that was previously discussed and Chief Whinna replied yes. Mayor Welsh confirmed this contract will cover K9 Remi through retirement.

A motion to approve the Agreement was made by Councilman Sims and seconded by Council President Ledrich. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote.

❖ CONTRACT with Gramco Business Communications to provide service calls, software support and parts, etc. to the Liberty Digital Recording System (Court, Council and Land Use Board recording system) at a cost of \$975. Term of contract is June 1, 2016 through June 1, 2017.

A motion to approve the Contract was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The m *Motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote*.

❖ REQUEST from the Lions Club to hold a Coin Drop on Friday, October 14, 2016 at the location of Broadway and Olive Street.

Clerk Helder advised a Certificate of Insurance and Hold Harmless certificate <u>are</u> is required by the Borough Insurance Company. and Councilman Sims stated he would take that information back to the membership.

A motion to approve the request, provided a Certificate of Insurance and Hold Harmless Agreement are submitted to the Municipal Clerk, was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote.

❖ REQUEST from Dan Copes, Executive Secretary of Rho Delta Sigma of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. representing Gloucester County New Jersey to utilize space (Soccer field at 216 Chestnut Street) to host distribution of food and perishables to the needy in conjunction with the South Jersey Food Bank of NJ. The Food Bank would be held every third Saturday of each month and the organization requested the Borough dispose of the empty pallets.

Council President Ledrich stated he believed Administrator Bittner contacted the individual to let him know the fields and parking lot are utilized on Saturdays with the

Fall soccer activities. Council President Ledrich also noted he didn't feel that the Public Works Department should be responsible for disposing of trash generated by an outside organization.

A motion to deny the request was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Sims. The motion to deny this request was unanimously approved by voice vote.

Mayor Welsh asked Clerk Helder to send a letter to the organization informing them of Council's decision.

#### **PUBLIC PORTION:**

- ❖ Joyce Lovell, 328 Summit Avenue, inquired about the property for sale at Block 101, Lots 10 and 10.2. Administrator Bittner confirmed the property is located off Almonesson Road and back near behind H the Hillside Avenue properties.
- ❖ Brian Waters, 226 Summit Avenue, asked that <u>a</u>Agendas be posted on the web site prior to the meetings.

## COMMENTS FROM MAYOR/COUNCIL/DEPARTMENT HEADS

- ❖ Engineer Bryson advised all New Jersey road projects are in a holding pattern due to an executive order issued by the Department of Transportation (DOT). Public Works Manager Domico expressed her concerns about the delays and how the winter will affect completion of the current road projects.
- Mayor Welsh advised he talked with some office staff and residents regarding the condensedfour day, ten hour work week and advised both residents and most of the staff are pleased with the new hours. Council President Ledrich commented if residents think it's beneficial and employees are happy, the hours should be extended at least until the end of the year. Councilman Sims stated, "we are here to serve the public, so if it's helping them, the hours should be extended." Councilman Mailley stated he was "good" with extending the hours.

A motion to extend the office hours (10 hours per day Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.) to the end of the year, pending further review, was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. A motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.

Mayor Welsh asked Administrator Bittner to change the sign on the front door to reflect the updated office hours.

#### COMMENTS FROM MAYOR/COUNCIL/DEPARTMENT HEADS (Continued)

❖ Mayor Welsh stated the Borough is waiting for a second estimate for needed repairs to the Little League building before proceeding with the necessary reparations.

A motion to repair the Klinger Avenue Little League building upon receipt of the lowest bid, as long as funding is available, was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Sims. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote.

❖ Mayor Welsh asked Council to consider leasing the Flotilla building to the Rolling Badges Motorcycle club. Administrator Bittner commented he spoke to a member of the club, who agreed that they would refurbish the building, clean the parking lot and perform general maintenance tasks in exchange for free use of the building. Administrator Bittner confirmed club members understand if the property becomes part of a redevelopment plan, they would have to vacate the building.

A motion to draw up a contract/lease to allow the Rolling Badges Motorcycle Club to utilize the old Flotilla building was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by roll call vote.

- ❖ Mayor Welsh stated Councilman Murtaugh wanted him to ask Chief Whinna about the "slowdown 25 mph" sign that was painted on the street at River Drive and whether or not stop signs should be added in the area because of the speeding. Discussion took place regarding motorists exceeding the speed limit and the cost of a radar trailer. Chief Whinna advised he may be able to borrow a radar trailer from the Mt. Ephraim Police Department to record motorists who may be speeding. Discussion also took place about using recovery or other funds to purchase a radar trailer and Chief Whinna stated the Borough of Brooklawn may be interested in splitting the cost of a Traffic Study Box.
- ❖ Public Works Manager Domico asked if the Rolling Badges Motorcycle Club will be assuming responsibility for the maintenance of the old Flotilla building and paying for utilities and was informed "yes" and that specific information will be included in the contract. Administrator Bittner confirmed it was still a Borough owned building.
- Councilman Sims confirmed with Chief Whinna that the individual who was arrested for all the graffiti in town would be responsible for restitution to those businesses whose property was defaced.

Mayor Welsh opened the meeting back up to the Public:

- ❖ Wendy Baxter, 10 Third Avenue, asked about the speeding on River Drive and advised Council the graffiti at the bridge by Verchio's was removed.
- ❖ Joyce Lovell, 328 Summit, suggested speed bumps be installed in certain areas of town to prevent speeding and was informed by the Mayor that speed bumps may be an issue with snow removal.
- ❖ Municipal Clerk Helder read RESOLUTION Resolution No.NO 101-2016 ~ AUTHORIZING EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS NEGOTIATION MATTERS

A motion to approve Resolution No. 101-2016 was made by Council President Ledrich and seconded by Councilman Mailley. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.
